Ellington Gains Firm Displaced by Renewal

ROCKVILLE (Special) — Rockville is losing another industry to Ellington, it was learned Thursday.

Officials of Acromold Products Corp. located on Brooklyn Street, in the redevelopment area, have purchased 3.5 acres at the corner of Lower Butcher Road and Windermere Avenue, in Ellington's industrial park.

No Surprise

This move came as no surprise, since company officials have not been satisfied with anything in Rockville suggested by the Redevelopment Agency.

Harry Zashut, vice president of Acromold, expressed satisfaction with the Ellington location, noting that it has water, sewers, gas and electricity. The site does not need much bulldozing

and manufacturing is already established there. Duo - Set, which formerly operated in Rockville, has a new plant located in this industrial park. Last year, Ellington voters authorized a \$25,000 bond issue to bring water and sewer lines to the park.

Acromold is planning to build a 10,000 square foot building for which bids have already been asked. Construction will start some time this year, Zashut said, depending on when the Redevelopment Agency requires the company to vacate its present quarters.

Acromold was founded in Rockville about five years ago, and specializes in custom plastic molding and molds. Donald Pelham is president.
