Acromold, Triangle Set Merger

ROCKVILLE (Special) —

The merger of Acromold Products Corp. and the Triangle Mfg. Co. has been announced by Donald Pelham, Acromold president. Acromold has a net worth of around \$80,000 and triangle of \$20,000.

Pelham said that the merger seemed logical from a business standpoint as the two companies complement each other. He noted that Triangle has been doing tool work for Acromold and that the two firms have been working closely together.

Operate As Division

October 1 has been set as the official date for the merger, Pelham said. He added that Tri-

angle probably will operate as a division of Acromold.

Acromold has been in business in Rockville at 95 Brooklyn St., for about two and one - half years, starting with a work crew of six which has increased to 15. Triangle was formerly located at 151 W. Main St., and moved to Brooklyn Street to share the same building with Acromold.

Plastic Molding

Custom plastic molding, such as mixer handles and appliance parts for the Iona Mfg. Co. of Manchester and molded vacuum bottle parts for Landers, Frary and Clark of New Britain are produced by Acromold, according to Pelham. Triangle makes small tools, dies and fixtures.

Clifford Hawley is Acromold vice president while triangle is headed by Harry Zashut.
