## 8 Directors To Be Named From CofC Slate of 16

**VERNON (Special)**—A slate of 16 nominees for the board of directors of the Rockville Area Chamber of Commerce will go out shortly to chamber members, with eight of these to be elected.

Names were presented to the board of directors at their noon luncheon Tuesday by Miss Evelyn Parizek of the nominating committee which is headed by John P. Sweeney.

Nat N. Schwedel pointed out that actually only six directors should be elected each year. Apparently due to some oversight when vacancies were filled the terms of eight members run out this year. He felt, and the directors agreed, that in the coming election, six directors should be elected for three-year terms, and the remaining two for either a one or two-year term, whichever group is short of its six members. This would put the chamber back on its regular schedule of six members being elected each year.

Ramsdell, superintendent of schools; Richard Rose, Southern New England Telephone Co.; Allen Schwedel, Amerbelle Corporation; Kenneth Waldron, Connecticut Light & Power; and Frederick Winkley, People's Savings Bank.

These eight directors when elected, together with the 10 whose terms hold over, will elect three directors for one-year terms to make the 21-member board. The entire board then elects officers.

President Howard Wolfanger expressed his appreciation and that of the other officers for the work and cooperation of the eight directors going off the board. They are: Mrs. Florence Loverin, Schwedel, Frank Gregory, Clifford Hawley, William Kellner, Seymour E. Lavitt, Chester M. Rau and Ralph Skillings.
